<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	This course is designed to prepare professionals to participate effectively in the development and negotiation of defense armaments cooperation agreements ranging from simple data exchange annexes to complex cooperative development, production, and support agreements. Students who successfully complete this course will be able to synthesize, integrate, and apply U.S. policy on international cooperative defense acquisition, including policies of the Departments of Defense, State, Commerce, and Treasury. The final outcome of the week is formulating and practicing negotiation of international acquisition agreements in accordance with U.S. policies, statutes, and regulations.

<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	<p>Twelve lesson blocks cover all of the major functional areas of the Foreign Disclosure Manual in detail, and include a number of practical exercises to reinforce key concepts. Course materials are unclassified.</p> <p>This course satisfies the mandatory foreign disclosure training requirement set forth in DoD 5230.20 dated 22 June 2005. Lesson Blocks include: Overview of Foreign Disclosure, NDP-1 &amp; Disclosure Criteria, General Disclosure Provisions, TTSARBs (overview, not how to prepare), The Foreign Disclosure System (FDS) and DoN Disclosure Database (DND2), International Agreements and DDLs, Overview of Program Protection Plans, Foreign Contracting and Foreign Ownership, Control and Influence (FOCI), Foreign Disclosure issues in FMS and Ship Transfers, Documentary Disclosures, Disclosures with Foreign Training, Export Licenses and Foreign Disclosure, The Foreign Visit System, Open Discussion Time for student issues and concerns and a Comprehensive Final Exam.</p>
<b>AUDIENCE:</b>	DoN disclosure professionals (DDAs/FDOs), foreign disclosure POCs and representatives, and others routinely working with foreign disclosure issues or desiring an in-depth understanding of foreign disclosure policies and procedures.

<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	<p>The International Programs Security Requirements course covers the principles and procedures that facilitate international technology transfer, export controls, and foreign disclosure. Specific lessons discuss the acquisition process for international program security, controlled unclassified and foreign government information, the National Disclosure Policy and the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR).</p> <p>The export approval and license process is covered along with the role of the Defense Security Service (DSS). Other topics include visits and assignments of foreign nationals, Multinational Industrial Security Working Group (MISWG) documents, Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS) and Foreign Ownership, Control or Influence (FOCI), and the transfer of classified information. The course culminates in a group practical exercise where participants are challenged to apply what they have learned during the course</p>
<b>AUDIENCE:</b>	All DoD personnel responsible for negotiating, overseeing, managing, executing or otherwise participating in international activities.

<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	The course teaches students to identify, analyze, and apply the laws, policies and processes that govern international security and technology transfer/control. It characterizes national security policy issues and export/import licensing constraints (as defined by the Departments of State, Commerce, and Defense) and guides evaluating their effects on domestic and international DoD programs. Students will learn the procedures for the export and import of defense and dual-use equipment and services, for handling classified and controlled unclassified program information, and for foreign visit control.
<b>AUDIENCE:</b>	Journeyman (lower-level managers) who hold, or have been selected for the following positions impacting international defense acquisition programs: program management and appropriate acquisition functionals, key government laboratory and center personnel, Defense and Military Department headquarters staff, and Security Cooperation Office personnel and defense attachés.

<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	This course teaches the basics of international acquisition for members of the Defense Acquisition and International Affairs work forces. The course emphasizes encouragement of armaments cooperation and interoperability with U.S. coalition and partner nations. National, DoD, and Military Department policy and regulations concerning international cooperative research, development, test, evaluation, production, and logistics support, as well as security assistance, are covered in some detail. The course identifies the roles and responsibilities of individuals, foreign governments, and industry involved in cooperative acquisition and security assistance programs. Students will learn about key types of agreements that promote U.S. international cooperation policy. The end goal is to provide the tools to prepare, formulate, and support a security assistance sale, direct commercial sale, cooperative acquisition, or hybrid international program.
<b>AUDIENCE:</b>	Program Management professionals in the international program management career path, this course is appropriate for personnel in international defense acquisition program offices, support offices, laboratories, headquarters staff offices, as well as offices of defense cooperation and attachés.
